At the time of this report we have 21 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 8 handlers at one kennel.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 394 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in Iraq from August 21, 2005 to January 15, 2008.
