This has been a very, very busy month for us! From November 1st to the 7th we have added four new kennels to our support project. Once again we have troops on the ground at Kirkuk and FOB Warrior. This is our first time to have handlers at Camp Cropper and Camp Bucca; that's right - 16 new handlers to the OD& P and K-9 Supply programs.

We are also continuing our support of three kennels at Camp Diamondback, Iraq, Manus AB, Kyrgyzstan, and Camp Lemonier, Africa. There are six personnel at those locations.

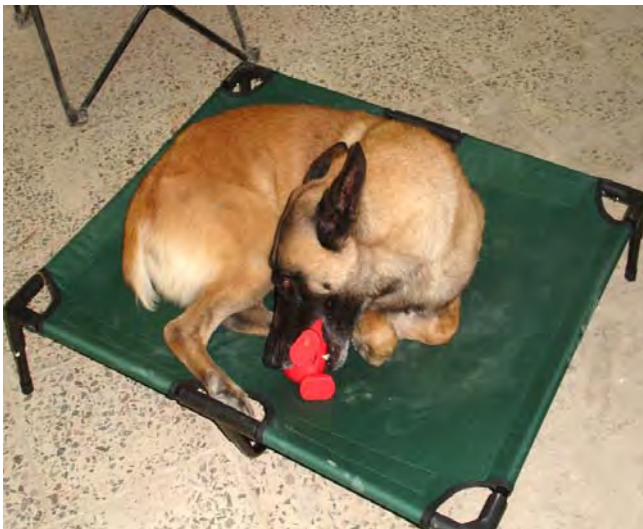

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of **325** pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in Iraq from August 21, 2005 to November 15, 2006.
