We are still working on another kennel – so stay tuned and be prepared to "Re-Up" and to start communicating with our new pups.

Our troops at Manus AB, Camp Cropper, Camp Bucca, and the rotation at Kirkuk, and LSA Diamondback have either safely rotated stateside or they are in a "packing stage" for the "Freedom Bird". I've heard from several of them and they are on leave with their family and friends – so expect communications to be a little slow for a while.

We will also have a group deploying in May/June, so please bear with us and we will make hook ups as soon as things get settled down.

# Tribute to Military Working Dog Killed in Action in Iraq Tinker Air Base Oklahoma

The 72d Security Forces Squadron/Military Working Dog Section will be holding a Vigil for MWD Marco (tattoo D108) at the kennels. Marco's remains were escorted to Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma by his handler SSgt Alissa B. Jones, on 4 April, 2007. The vigil will be held at Building 1089, the TSgt Norton Military Working Dog Facility. We will be on duty from 0730 hours to 1630 hour Monday to Friday, for all who may want to come to pay their respect. We will be holding the Vigil until the day of his memorial service during the week of the 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2007. Following the memorial service, Marco's remains will then be presented to his last handler SSgt Alissa B. Jones, during the ceremony.

On January 20, 2007, MWD Marco D108 was Killed in Action (KIA) while on patrol in Baghdad in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Marco, a seven year old Belgian Malinois, an Explosive Detector and Patrol Dog (EDD), died while doing what he loved. Marco and SSgt Alissa Jones were attached to the 2D Brigade Combat Team, working in support of C-5/20 Infantry in Baghdad, Iraq when Marco suffered from acute cardio respiratory arrest secondary to electrocution.

The MWD team was assisting with a Cordon and Search, looking for weapon's caches, explosives and materials used to make improvised explosive devices (IED's). During this tour in Iraq, Marco assisted me and the US Army in locating numerous finds, allowing coalition forces to seize and destroy potentially deadly materials. Along with explosive detection, Marco also served as a physical and psychological deterrent to Iraqi Nationals while conducting missions in downtown Baghdad.

Marco was whelped March 1, 2000, and entered the United States Air Force in March of 2001. After completing training at Lackland Air Force Base, TX, he became a member of the 72D Security Forces Squadron K-9 family at Tinker Air Force Base, OK in January 2003. While serving at Tinker, Marco had been deployed to California, Missouri, New York, Michigan, Wisconsin, Texas, Nevada, South West Asia and Iraq (for the third time).

MWD Marco was more then a dog, he was a free spirited, loving companion and partner. We often described Marco as a small child with four legs, 42 teeth and hair. He would be running around playing one minute and fast asleep the next. He was the kind of partner that would love and nurture, but the minute he or someone around him was threatened, it was all business. He was one of the smallest dogs stationed at Tinker, but had one of the largest personalities; he loved the spotlight, and could not get enough attention from man or canine.



## Here's this month's update on the K-9 Supply Program

At the time of this report we have 18 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 9 handlers at four kennels/assignments.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 348 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in Iraq from August 21, 2005 to April 15, 2007.
