We recently heard from PFC Deborah Rush and it looks like she has really been busy since leaving FOB Warrior in November 2007. We recently heard this from PFC Rush "I am sending a picture of my reenlistment from Ft Bragg and a couple of pictures of where I work now. Even though what I do is beneficial to people all over the world and completely legal, it's still controversial"

So... "Where am I now"... I redeployed to Ft Bragg, NC when I left Kirkuk in November 2007. In Feb. 2008, I reenlisted for an assignment in Washington DC in Research & Development at Walter Reed Army Institute of Research. Since I'm actually assigned to the Navy, I'll be here for the next 3 years. I'm in the Department of Animal Resources and work with monkeys (Rhesus, Aotus, and African Greens). I love my job, but will always have the military working dogs first in my heart. I truly miss working with them.

With the monkeys, we have protocols that involve different vaccines. Some of the vaccines we are currently working with are malaria, SIV, dengue, and anthrax. We have other studies that don't include vaccines, as well. Besides the department I work in, other departments work with different animals and do really good things for the Soldier. For example, we are testing different HEMCON/quickclot bandages. We have studies that improve the protective gear that the military wear. All the new IBA and Kevlars that come out are because of the research that was done at NMRC/WRAIR. I'm proud of what I do because I know it has meaning and I can see the progress and results.

I know I'm not a dog handler, but I want to thank you with all my heart for "adopting" me into your program. Well, it's past my bedtime... I have to get up at 0400 to be at work on time. I have to in-process pigs in the morning! AND - I always have my Leatherman on me. It comes in handy quite often and when I use it I get to show it off and explain who gave it to me. Thanks!!"

At the time of this report we have 16 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 14 handlers assigned to seven kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 635 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in Iraq from August 21, 2005 to September 15, 2008.
