Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 695 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 21, 2005 to December 15, 2008.
