Hello everyone! We are currently supporting five (5) kennels and fifteen (15) deployed Air Force, Army, and Navy teams as of July 15, 2011. July 2011 brings us to five years and ten months of operation for our "Old Dawgs & Pups" program. Once again, I'd just like to say thank you to all of you that have supported our awesome programs and especially our troops and their canine partners deployed down range. We have two (2) new Pups to introduce this month.

Area of Operation Status - K-9 Teams Arriving/Departing

We are currently supporting troops at Joint Base Balad, Iraq; Bagram Air Base, FOB ACS-2/Kandahar, Afghanistan; and Ali Al Salem, Kuwait; and Manas Transit Center, Kyrgyzstan. We have one (1) new Pup to introduce this month.

Haboobs are commonly observed throughout the world. This photograph was taken in the AOR recently. Haboob winds are created by the collapse of a thunderstorm. During thunderstorm formations, winds move in a direction opposite to the storm's travel, and they will move from all directions into the storm. When the storm collapses and begins to release precipitation, wind directions reverse, gusting outward from the storm and generally gusting the strongest in the directions of the storm's travel.

Other News concerning OD&P Graduates TSgt Christopher Beavers – Kennel Master FOB Warrior – Spring 2007



I'm now stationed at Joint Base Langley-Eustis in VA. For the last couple of months I've put together the 633 SFS first comprehensive Community Policing Initiative. I've created a 9 person Community Police section within our military family housing area off base. We provide law enforcement and outreach programs to over 3.5K residents. In the last few short months we have established a Neighborhood Watch program for local residents. We regularly assign teams to conduct nightly walks utilizing our cops, residents and local law enforcement that share our jurisdiction. My section has also initiated the DARE Program and Stay Smart Program at our local youth activities center for over 180 kids. We use these programs to educate them on the dangers of drugs, alcohol and sex. We also just get the kids in the class to just get comfortable around us and talk about whatever's on their minds. We've initiated a Citizens Police Academy for residents as well. This is an 8 week program in which citizens are instructed and trained on the things we as cops do and why. It covers things like criminal law, investigations, tactical ops, domestic violence, DUI and narcotic investigations and weapons training. The citizens seem to really enjoy it and get a lot out of the material. The majority of our time and energy though is put into daily law enforcement throughout the area. The residents around here keep us pretty busy!

Once I put on my Master stripe in the next few months, I will likely be moved elsewhere in the squadron. Just can't convince them that we need a MSgt in the kennels here...lol. There's not a day that goes by where I don't miss pushin' puppies. The job satisfaction and camaraderie is unmatched in anything else I've done since leaving K-9 at the end of 2008. I've worked everything from Flight Chief to NCOIC, Police Services to Superintendent of CSS. Nothing even comes close to the time I put in with my dogs and fellow handlers!! I tell every handler I come across to enjoy it while they can, because it will be over before they know it! Things have not been all bad though. In my time since I left Kirkuk in 2007 I've gotten remarried to my lovely wife Amanda, had a son, Miles, who is now 1.5 years old and bought a house. Other than missing K9, life couldn't be better.

At the time of this report we have 15 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 15 handlers assigned to five (5) kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 1,401 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 21, 2005 to July 15, 2011.
