Hello everyone! We are currently supporting seven (7) kennels and fourteen (14) deployed Air Force, Army, and Navy teams as of November 15, 2011. November 2011 brings us to six years and two month of operation for our "Old Dawgs & Pups" program. Once again, I'd just like to say thank you to all of you that have supported our awesome programs and especially our troops and their canine partners deployed down range.

U. S. announced Troop pull out of Iraq by the end of 2011

On October 21, 2011 President Obama announced that approximately 39,000 troops will withdraw from Iraq by December 31, 2011. We are currently supporting two bases in Iraq, Joint Base Balad and Sather Air Base. We expect to hear more from our K-9 troops concerning their departure as the events unfold in the coming months.

We have supported 189 K-9 personnel from the US Air Force, US Army, and the US Navy serving as MWD teams, Kennel Masters, Trainers, and Vet Techs, and civilians since August of 2005.

In addition, we have supported sixteen (16) kennels at Ali Air Base, Camp Tallil, Kirkuk, FOB Warrior, FOB Speicher, FOB O'Ryan, FOB Delta, FOB Falcon, Camp Diamondback, Camp Bucca, Camp Cropper, Camp Victory, Camp Rustamiyah, Camp Basra, Joint Base Balad, and Sather Air Base, Iraq.

Area of Operation Status - K-9 Teams Arriving/Departing

We are currently supporting troops at Joint Base Balad, and Sather Air Base (BIAP) Iraq; Bagram Air Base, FOB Lagman, FOB Shank and FOB Howe-Z-Madad, Afghanistan; and Ali Al Salem, Kuwait. We have five (5) new Pups to introduce this month.

Pups heading home from the AOR

Joint Base Balad, Iraq: TSgt Angelo Reategui, Kennel Master, is safely back at the 820th Group at Moody AFB, Georgia. Thanks again Angelo – you have been a great help tour program during your deployments. TSgt Reategui's departure from JBB ends our four year support role for the 332nd ESFG. We have supported 36 MWD teams, including Kennel Masters and Trainers.

Joint Base Balad K-9 Section Closes

On November 5, 2011, TSgt Angelo Reategui, Kennel Master, at Joint Base Balad, Iraq closed down the K-9 section and headed stateside. Due to the “draw down” this marked the last tour of the 332nd ESFG. TSgt Reategui's departure from JBB ends our four year support role for the 332nd ESFG. We have supported 36 MWD teams, including Kennel Masters and Trainers.

Forty-six Old Dawgs & Friends of K-9 have supported those 36 teams since 2008.

OD& P has shipped 82 pieces of equipment to Joint Base Balad. The equipment included 12 Guardian Pet Cots, 12 2/1 food bowls, 12 water bowls, 22 PSI water bowls for Outside the Wire (OTW) use, 2 50 foot water hoses, 2 water hose portable reels, 2 “Y” water connectors, 10 Udder Tugs, and 8 rolls of window tint for their vehicles at a cost of \$1,122.67.

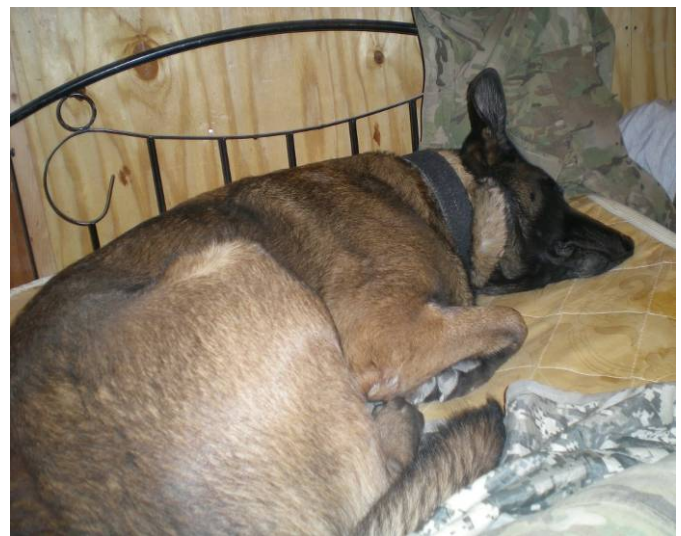

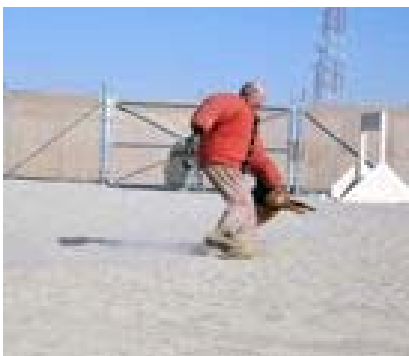
Military Working Dog Receives On-the-Spot Promotion From Tech Sergeant to Four Star General!

We've worked up the chain of command and have successfully had all of the forthcoming UTCs changed to provide more capabilities, and we are now actively patrolling several miles around Bagram, to include searching through local villages, snap TCPs on civilian highways, hidden LP/Ops, and actively chasing down the insurgents on their own turf.

Old Dawgs Learn New Tricks

Bringing dog soldiers home, Western Union Elementary fourth grader bakes her heart out in support of military dogs

The story of Duchess, a dog euthanized during the Vietnam war, weighed heavily on the mind and heart of Western Union Elementary fourth grader Carol Jeffcoat.

Carol's great-uncle Dave Miller served in the Vietnam war as a military dog handler. Soldiers euthanized his dog Duchess rather than sending her home for budgetary reasons. When Carol learned the same practice goes on in current wars, her wheels began to turn, according to her mother Lisa Jeffcoat.

A visit to a neighboring church got Carol started on the notion of filling up a jar of savings to "help bring dogs soldiers home," Lisa Jeffcoat said. When saving on her own wasn't filling up her jar quite quickly enough, Carol got the idea of a bake sale.

In January, Carol began saving her \$3-a-week allowance, along with every penny she earned. By July, she had raised \$150. "We took her money, bought the supplies with coupons, and then Carol baked her heart out," said Lisa. The bake sale that ensued on September 11 surpassed everyone's expectations.

Carol used her funds to make flyers passed around in school, and received a lot of support from teachers and students at her school. Her mother's Facebook posting encouraged people to come and eat for a good cause. "Everyone began to repost and the word got out," Lisa exclaimed. At the end of the event, Carol raised \$1,145.75 courtesy of the bake sale and subsequent donations.

"I baked over 300 cupcakes and 300 rolls," Carol said. "It took about three weeks to bake, and one day to sell." "We sold everything on the table!" her mother noted.

Miller presented the funds during the Vietnam Security Police Association annual reunion on Oct. 6 in Dayton, Ohio, in honor of Old Dawgs and Pups, an organization that supports new handlers.

Upon receiving Carol's check, the 250 in attendance gave her a standing ovation for all her efforts and passion on behalf of K-9 soldiers and their dogs.

Carol's efforts are in keeping with Western Union Principal Rita Webb's motto, who recognized Carol for her outstanding civic duty. Despite the six months of savings, and the weeks of baking—Carol may be up for a repeat performance. When asked, she replied, "I think I'll do this again!"

As a follow up to this story, Dale Miller (Ubon) and his wife traveled to the VSPA reunion at Wright Patterson AFB, Ohio to make this donation.
