Hello everyone! We are currently supporting 10 (ten) kennels and eighteen (18) deployed Air Force, Army, and Navy teams as of December 15, 2011. December 2011 brings us to six years and three month of operation for our “Old Dawgs & Pups” program. Once again, I’d just like to say thank you to all of you that have supported our awesome programs and especially our troops and their canine partners deployed down range.

Area of Operation Status - K-9 Teams Arriving/Departing

We are currently supporting troops at Sather Air Base (BIAP) Iraq; Bagram Air Base, FOB Lagman, FOB Shank, FOB Howz-E-Madad, Kandahar Air Base, Camp Arena, Heart, and FOB Salerno, Afghanistan; Ali Al Salem, Kuwait, and Manis Air Base, Kyrgyzstan. We have four (4) new Pups to introduce this month.

MWD Eddy (E049) was laid to rest at a memorial service at Edwards AFB, California. Eddy was partnered with SSgt Jason Fields while deployed at the 407th ESFS, Ali Air Base, Iraq February 2006 – Supported by Phil Carroll & Don Graham. Eddy was also partnered with SrA Eric Vega while deployed at Joint Base Balad, Iraq, February 2009 – Supported by Jon Hemp. Because of poor health and medical conditions that had become untreatable, Eddy had to be euthanized, said Army Capt. Allison Schroder, Edwards Veterinary Treatment Facility, officer in charge. A memorial service was held on November 30, 2011, outside of the MWD kennels on base. With the playing of taps, Eddy's years of service to the U.S. Air Force was remembered.

Eddy served 11 years in the Air Force. Eddy deployed to the Middle East five times, twice to Kuwait and three times to Iraq from 2003 to 2009. "Ever loyal, ever faithful," said Maj. Brian Clouse, 95th Air Base Wing chaplain, of the dogs during his opening invocation.

A total of **1,462** pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 21, 2005 to December 15, 2011.
