Hello everyone! We are currently supporting eight (8) kennels and twenty-two (22) deployed Air Force, Army, and Navy teams as of March 15, 2012. March 2012 brings us to six years and six month of operation for our "Old Dawgs & Pups" program. At the time of this report we have 23 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 22 handlers assigned to eight (8) kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 1,565 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 21, 2005 to March 15, 2012.
