Hello everyone! We are currently supporting six (6) kennels and twenty-seven (27) deployed Air Force, Army, and Navy teams as of April 15, 2015. April 2015 brings us to nine years and eight months of operation for our "Old Dawgs & Pups" program. Once again, I'd just like to say thank you to all of you that have supported our awesome programs and especially our troops and their canine partners deployed down range.

Area of Operation Status - K-9 Teams Arriving/Departing

Due to the worldwide security issues and concerns for safeguarding our troops, we will not be listing the name of the bases or countries, in which our troops are deployed. All locations will be listed as "Undisclosed Location Southwest Asia" (UDL). We are currently supporting troops at six locations in Southwest Asia. We have no new pups to introduce this month.

Pups arriving in the AOR

879th ESFS - UDL #4 Southwest Asia: SSgt Jason Albrecht & MWD Cigan deployed from the 20th SFS, Shaw AFB, South Carolina. This is SSgt Albrecht's third tour with Old Dawgs & Pups, there by qualifying him as an Alpha Dog Award! Doc Hodges (Ubon/Korat) again sponsors the team.

UDL #8 Southwest Asia: SSgt Alexandra Springman & MWD Emor have been Forward Deployed to an UDL Southwest Asia. Jon Hemp (TSN) supports the team.

379th ESFS – UDL # 1 Southwest Asia: SSgt Robert Beaudoin, Trainer, has been Forward Deployed to this Undisclosed location. Bill Cummings (U-Tapao) supports SSgt Beaudoin.

Air For Paws – First Response Resuscitation Kits (New OD&P Partner)





Old Dawgs & Pups, in co-operation with "Air for Paws", (www.AirForPaws.com) has obtained life saving first response Resuscitation Kits to be donated and provided to deployed Military Working Dog locations in Southwest Asia. In addition, at this time, equipment will be made available to several stateside United States Air Force installations if they are interested in the equipment for their kennels.

All of these personnel are medically trained to treat their canine partners in the event of emergencies. These bases will be dealing with many problems that this equipment would be very useful. We have asked that all units that receive this equipment to coordinate the use with their veterinary personnel that are responsible for the care of the Military Working Dogs under their care.

After providing the Air For Paws Resuscitation Kits, one Kennel Master provided the following feedback. "We are more than interested in having these kits for our unit, several if we could. The environment we work in and how much we work these dogs it would be a very helpful tool to have on hand. It could be the difference between life and death for these dogs".

We believe this is the response that we will receive from the kennels that we support during deployments in remote locations worldwide. We feel the training video can and should be incorporated in training with the established veterinarians that are responsible for the care of our Military Working Dogs.

Each kit will contain the following equipment: (1) large resuscitation mask (ie; German Shepherds), (1) small resuscitation mask (ie; Malinois, etc.), (1) Ambu bag, (1) Oxygen Hose adaptor with Ambu bag, (1) Training DV/DVD, testimonials for Fire, Rescue, Police departments that have been supplied with this equipment, and (1) AFP Carrying Case for the equipment. Handlers, if you would like additional information to obtain this equipment for your home station, please reply to this newsletter to provide me with contact information of your Kennel Master or have your Kennel Master contact Bill Cummings, Co-Coordinator, Old Dawgs & Pups. Kits can be customized to fit individual kennel needs, for patrol vehicle or kennel use. Air For Paws will donate the kits and Old Dawgs & Pups will coordinate the effort on their behalf.

NOTE: The first of these units have been shipped to Units supported by OD&P in Southwest Asia.





Here's this month's update on the K-9 Supply Program

At the time of this report we have 26 members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting 27 handlers assigned to six (6) kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program volunteers. The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 2,229 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 15, 2005 to April 15, 2015. "Old Dawgs & Friends" have supported 120 kennels and 447 K-9 personnel via our program. For additional information on the program please go to:

We have purchased and shipped \$29,105.00 worth of supplies to 119 kennels solely via your personal donations.
