

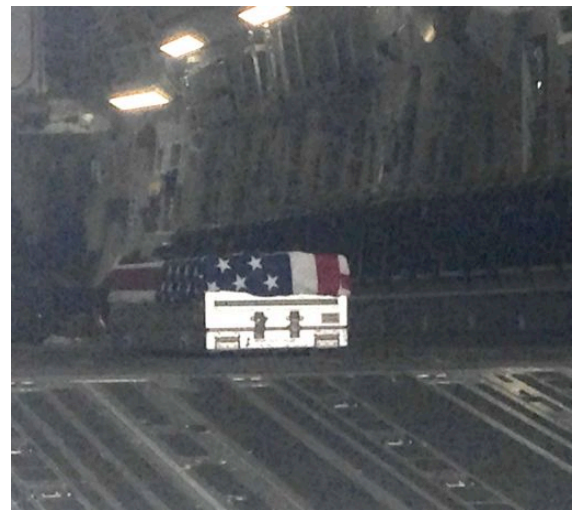

Military Working Dog Jonny – N414 May 2, 2015 Al Udeid Air Base, Qatar

Military Working Dog Jonny/ N414 entered his Air Force career in 2009. He was certified for patrol and explosives detection. His first assignment was with the 7th Security Forces Squadron at Dyess AFB, TX. Over the past six years, Jonny has had four handlers; SSgt Sean Davis, SSgt Andre Hernandez, SSgt Erica McRell, and SrA Jerry Quintanilla with whom he has deployed on JET taskings to Jt. Base Balad, Iraq in 2011, Bagram, Afghanistan in 2012, Kandahar, Afghanistan in 2013. His last deployment was to Al Udeid AB, Qatar with SrA Quintanilla. He passed away on 29 April 2015 from medical complications. MWD Jonny also provided flawless security for many high profile events and distinguished visitors worldwide. The men and women of the 379th Expeditionary Security Forces Squadron salute his loyal service to our nation!

Hello everyone! We are currently supporting five (5) kennels and thirty (30) deployed Air Force, Army, Navy, and Marine teams as of May 15, 2015. May 2015 brings us to nine years and nine months of operation for our “Old Dawgs & Pups” program. Once again, I’d just like to say thank you to all of you that have supported our awesome programs and especially our troops and their canine partners deployed down range.

Area of Operation Status - K-9 Teams Arriving/Departing

Due to the worldwide security issues and concerns for safeguarding our troops, we will not be listing the name of the bases or countries, in which our troops are deployed. All locations will be listed as “Undisclosed Location Southwest Asia” (UDL). We are currently supporting troops at five locations in Southwest Asia. We have three (3) new pups to introduce this month.

Air For Paws Resuscitation Kits shipped to Southwest Asia



On March 31st and April 1st, 2015 Old Dawgs & Pups and Air For Paws shipped the first Air For Paws Resuscitation kits to three of our deployed kennels in Southwest Asia and to the USAF Air Combat Command, Virginia and the Department of Defense, JBSA, Texas for official approval for use at deployed and stateside base approval. Air Combat Command granted approval for their use on May 6, 2015. Each kit contains Ambu Bags, facemasks, an instructional Video, a towel and leashes for use during canine breathing emergencies.

Established in 1986 as a domestic and international disaster response resource, sponsored by the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department, Virginia Task Force 1 is rostered by approximately 200 specially trained career and volunteer fire and rescue personnel, with expertise in the rescue of victims from collapsed structures, following a natural or man-made catastrophic event. The team is comprised of emergency managers and planners, physicians and paramedics and includes specialists in the fields of structural engineering, heavy rigging, collapse rescue, logistics, hazardous materials, communications, canine and technical search.

Virginia Task Force 1 has partnerships with the Department of Homeland Security/Federal Emergency Management Agency for domestic response and the United States Agency for International Development/Office of U.S. Foreign Disaster Assistance during international missions. As a part of the Fairfax County Fire & Rescue Department, the task force maintains constant operational readiness as a local resource for residents of Fairfax County and surrounding jurisdictions.

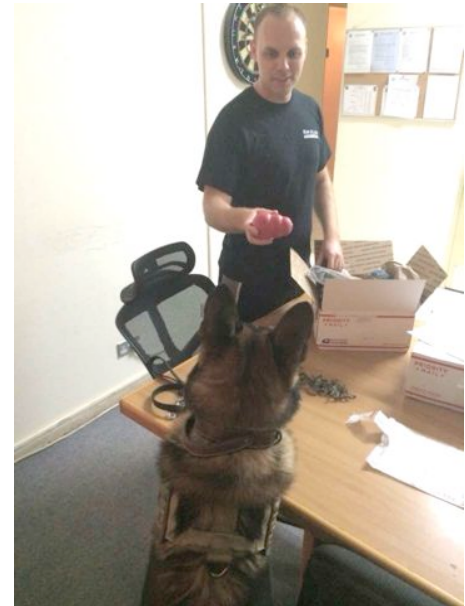

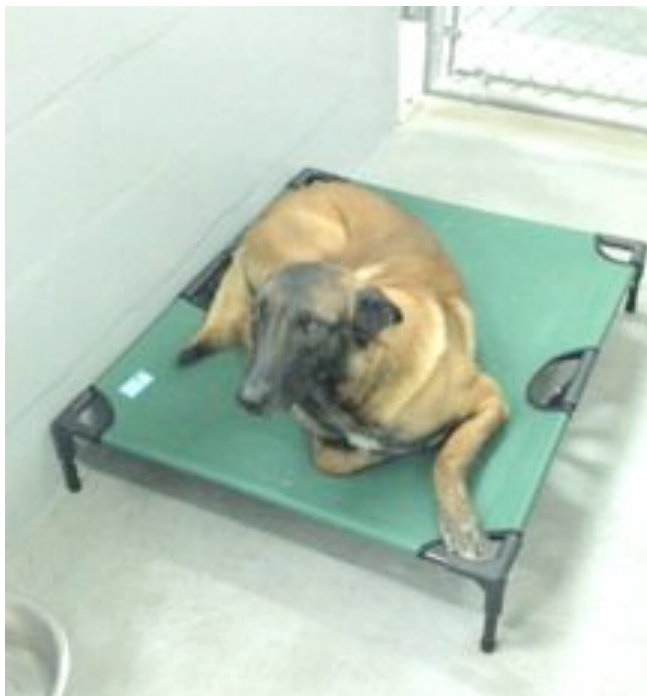

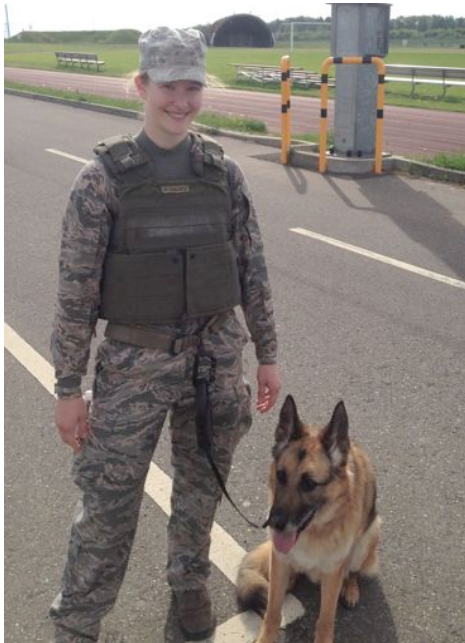

Here's this month's update on the K-9 Supply Program

At the time of this report we have **29** members of the “Old Dawgs & Pups” program actively supporting **30** handlers assigned to five (5) kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the “Old Dawgs & Pups” program volunteers. The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 2,263 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 15, 2005 to May 15, 2015. “Old Dawgs & Friends” have supported **121** kennels and **450** K-9 personnel via our program. We have purchased and shipped **\$29,607.00** worth of supplies to **121** kennels solely via your personal donations. Including the Leatherman Corporation and other noted major donations; our program has supplied a total of **\$99,807.00** to deployed Military Working Dog teams.
