At the time of this report we have **19** members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting **19** handlers assigned to four (4) kennels in Southwest Asia.

Our K-9 Supply program has been coordinated and funded by the "Old Dawgs & Pups". The supporters are members of the VSPA, VDHA, and friends of K-9. A total of 1,753 pieces of equipment has been delivered to our K-9 troops serving in the AOR from August 21, 2005 to July 15, 2013.
