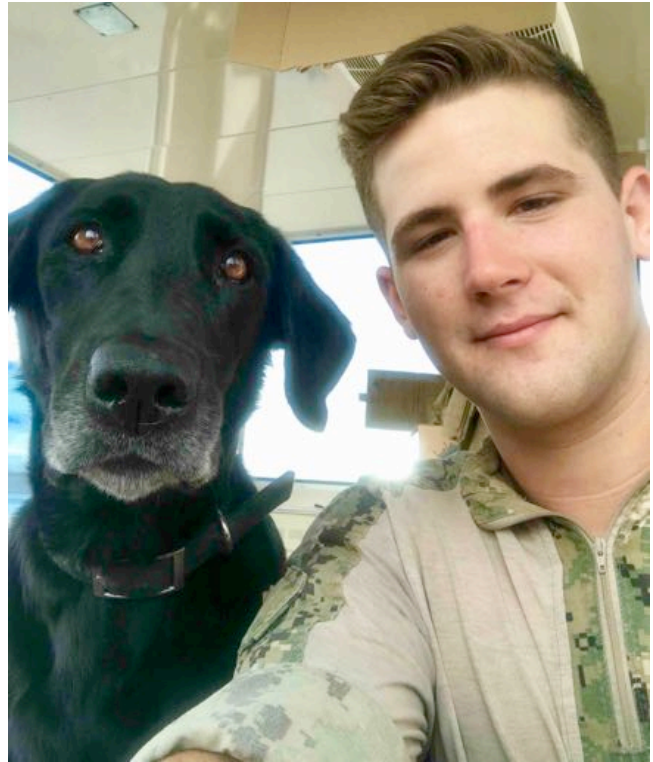

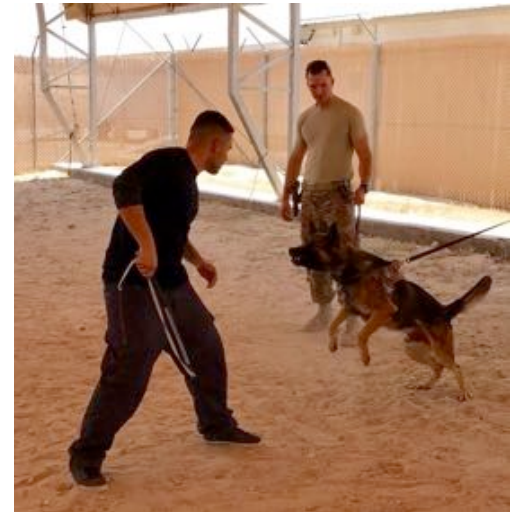

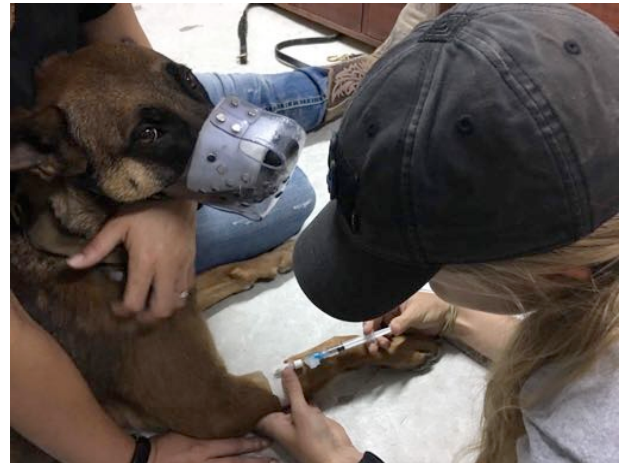

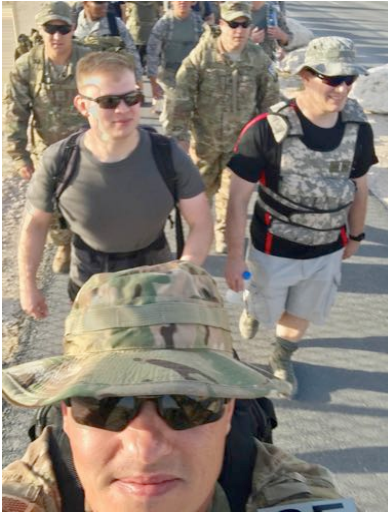

At the time of this report we have **30** members of the "Old Dawgs & Pups" program actively supporting **32** handlers assigned to seven (7) kennels in Southwest Asia.
